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
About the Course

Medium Term Plan Stage 1 - A new start Autumn Term 1



In this module:

During this half term the children will look at France as a country and start the early stages of conversation building to include greetings, feelings and names. The children will also be introduced to numbers and colours.

Through songs, games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, they will explore the following content, topics and language:

Greetings

- Discover where France is in the world
- Learn how to say greetings in French
- Learn how to ask and answer how they are feeling
- Learn how to ask somebody their name, and how to introduce their name in French

Numbers

- Learn to say and remember numbers from 1 to 10

Colours

- Learn to say colours in French

Learning Objective for each lesson:

- 1) I can say and write a greeting and a farewell in French.
- 2) I can ask and answer the question 'How are you?'
- 3) I can say 'My name is...' and ask 'What is your name?' in French.
- 4) I can say some numbers between 0 and 10.
- 5) I can remember and write some numbers between 0 and 10.
- 6) I can say some colours in French.

Key Performance Indicators

Colours are words that describe objects. We call them "**adjectives**". Watch out in French every time we meet the colours as the spelling might change to match the object the colour describes.

When you ask a question in French you can turn a sentence into a question **by raising the pitch of your voice at the end** of the question. e.g. Ça va? Ça va.

Fact bank

"H" is just a "breath" in French. Try saying the number 8 in French "**huit**".

What other interactive areas are there within the units?

Learning outcomes

Teachers will be able to:

3. Plan rich integrated thematic French language units that are culturally focused & language-targeted, incorporating lessons, activities and assessments
4. Revise, learn, practice and build out their own French language skills & competencies across vocabulary, phrases, pronunciations and language functions

Modules

Module 1 - Introducing your class to French: We begin our exciting MFL journey by setting out and exploring the rationale for MFL, together with a synthesis of the great guidance & pointers that we distil and disseminate from 'Languages Connect', The Primary Framework, the PLC and The 'Say Yes to Languages' initiative etc.

We introduce the CPD College learning platform containing rich language lessons + projects, where teachers acquire teaching ideas around an awareness of languages and cultures and build out their own communicative competence with Emilie, our French specialist.

We present the Communicative Language Teaching (CLT) approach + songs & stories. We detail project-based learning activities to build awareness of French language and culture.

Teachers become students : Under themes, teachers learn and practice key vocabulary, phrases and language functions through Emilie's instructed videos. They take part in staged assessments e.g. vocabulary + pronunciation tests. They explore and reflect on units & lesson plans.

Theme 1: A New Start

- Let's learn French! Greetings
- Project - Discover where or Origin of words & expressions
- Learn how to say greetings in French
- Learn to ask and answer how they are feeling
- Learn to ask somebody their name and to introduce their name in French
- Numbers: Learn to say and remember numbers from 1 to 10
- Colours: Learn to say colours in French

Theme 2: Calendars & Celebrations: Theme is fireworks, perfect for Halloween.

- Learning the days of the week, months, etc., through our Videos 2 Teach Approach with Emilie.
- Fireworks colours: Revisit and recall colours.
- Learn new colours
- Calendar Time: Learn the names of days of the week / Follow a story about days of the week / Learn the months of the year / Recognise the nouns written down / Express their birthday month. Date: Write the date in French.
- Celebrations: We explore Christmas traditions in France.

Module 2 - Building confidence: We detail the 'Multisensory Approach to Language Instruction', together with the idea of using game-based learning to support teaching a new language.

In the themes below, teachers learn and practice key vocabulary, phrases, and language functions through Emilie's instructed videos. They take part in staged assessments e.g. vocabulary + pronunciation tests. They explore and reflect on module lesson plans. We scope projects e.g. to explore and make connections across languages.

Theme: Animals - this unit introduces teachers to nouns, they learn the plurals of animal nouns and express which animal they have as well as which one is their favourite. Teachers go on to follow a story about animals and use this as a model to write their own sentences. Through songs, games, native speaker clips, independent tasks and a story, they will explore:

- Animal nouns: Learn the nouns for animals / Learn the plural for animal nouns.
- Animal sentences: Learn to say which animal they have / Learn how to say what their favourite animal is.
- Animal story: Follow a story about animals / Write sentences about animals using a model.

Theme: The Hungry Giant - revisit numbers 0-20 and introduce polite requests, and finish with an enjoyable simple target language story, board game and performance about "The Hungry Giant". Through songs, games and independent tasks, they will explore:

- Fruit and vegetable nouns: Singular and plural nouns for some fruits and vegetables
- Revisit numbers 0-20 in French.
- Hungry Giant: Follow and understand a simple story / Say and write a polite request / Play a simple board game / Join in with retelling a story / Create your own "Hungry Giant" story.

Additional Themes:

- The French Carnival = Cultural insight into Carnivals in France + Opportunity to design a carnival mask + Theme:
- Going on a Picnic (French Food).

Module 3 - Expanding vocabulary and sentences: We continue our immersive language learning journey by exploring the research on using scaffolding and sentence builders to support effective language instruction for students. We reflect on the opportunities for language immersion as a methodology for teaching a new language.

Next, we dive into the themes below, where teachers learn and practice key vocabulary, phrases and language functions through Emilie's instructed videos. They take part in staged assessments e.g. vocabulary & pronunciation tests.

Theme: My Town Teachers learn shop names in town, explore shopping in France, and practise asking for shop locations. Through songs, games, native speaker clips, and tasks, we focus on:

- Fireworks: Revisit and recall colours / Write a 4-line poem or rhyme about fireworks using colours and numbers.
- Classroom commands: Practise classroom instructions / Practise writing useful commands.
- Places in town: Explore what shopping is like in France, similarities and differences between here and in France / Practise asking where something is / Respond with the structure 'Here is...' / etc.
- Review sample language & awareness projects e.g. projects to investigate how languages relate to and influence each other.

Theme 2: Alien Family

- We introduce an alien family and learn the nouns for family members & introduce one family member, using this as an opportunity to recall personal information.
- We learn facial features in French, learning nouns in the singular and plural, and use them to describe the face of an alien.
- Through songs, games, native speaker clips and tasks, teachers will learn the nouns for parts of the face / Learn the plural for parts of the face nouns / Write simple sentences to describe an alien's face.

Additional themes presented in the above format:

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- Theme 3: Welcome to My School
 - Theme 4: Moving Our Bodies
 - Theme 5: At the Doctors + Jungle Animals
 - Theme 6: Summertime

Module 4 - Meaningful conversation: We begin with a presentation and reflection on using learning through movement (TPR) to support language instruction and a suite of activity suggestions, such as using the French equivalent of Simon Says (Jacques a dit) to stand up, sit down, etc.

Next, we spotlight the opportunities for cross-curricular integration and embedding French into other subjects to provide meaningful language connections. Again – we scope project-based learning activities e.g. to investigate languages in use across the school and link to data in maths. Then, it's off into language learning zone to practice key vocabulary, phrases and language functions through Emilie's instructed videos, to complete vocabulary & pronunciation tests and reflect on unit lesson plans.

Theme: Let's Visit the City In the city

- Explore a city in France to include reading and understanding facts
- Look at nouns for places in a city, including shops
- Explore language for buying tickets to a tourist attraction, including the polite request
- Describe a city in the role of a tour guide.
- Souvenir shopping: Learn and remember nouns for souvenirs
- Recognise and understand prices
- Ask for a price.

Theme: Off to the Beach Today!

- We learn about beaches in France and items you take to the seaside.
- They familiarise themselves with persuasive sentences about visiting the seaside to create and perform a spoken advert and a leaflet about visiting the seaside.
- In my beach bag: Find out about beaches in France / Learn nouns for items to take to the beach.
- Come to the beach! Use persuasive sentences to create and perform a spoken advert about the seaside
- Use persuasive sentences to create a leaflet about the seaside.
- Sandcastle sentences: Create sentences about the seaside using conjunctions.

Additional themes in the above format:

- Theme 3: Me & My Friends
- Theme 4: At the Market
- Theme 5: Clothes
- Theme 6: Out of this World (Planets)

Module 5 - Embedding French into the classroom & beyond: As we enter the final stages, we now pull together the knowledge (what students learn) - Vocabulary, Grammar, Pronunciation rules, cultural knowledge etc and skills (what students can do) - Speaking skills, reading skills, writing skills etc. and showcase the full immersive that can support any school's imminent MFL

journey.

We synthesise research and propose the power of inquiry-based learning to support the teaching of French and cultural awareness (e.g. why do French people greet each other with kisses on the cheek?), along with using Pair and Group work to support collaborative language practise.

Next, into the language learning zone we go to practice key vocabulary, phrases and language functions, through Emilie's instructed videos, to complete vocabulary & pronunciation tests and reflect on unit lesson plans.

Project: find out about the culture of going to cafés in France. Through games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, they will explore the following themes:

Theme: Café culture

- Learn about the culture of going to cafés in France
- Learn vocabulary for food and drinks and express opinions about them
- Create a menu. At the café: Learn phrases to politely order food and drink at the café
- Play games to familiarise yourself with café roleplay language and phrases
- Write and perform café conversations.

Theme: Houses & Homes Through games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, they will:

- Learn nouns for rooms in a house
- Learn nouns for furniture in the house
- Read, say and write descriptive sentences
- Explore French castles and new nouns associated with castles

Additional themes in the above format:

- Theme 3: This is Me
- Theme 4: Playing Sports
- Theme 5: My Best Day Ever
- Theme 6: Let's Celebrate
